At the time of the crime they were working as domestic servants for Mr. Burmeister, who runs a waste disposal business. Maria and Luca are desperate, but one thing they know for sure: Their parents are innocent. Together with the White Ravens, their friends at boarding-school, they uncover an evil plot. The hold-up was a fake, set up to frame their parents. It was all about jealousy and revenge, and an imminent pollution scandal. They find an unlikely champion in the unpopular son of the boarding-school's headmistress. He's the one to come up with the right idea how to prove their parents' innocence!

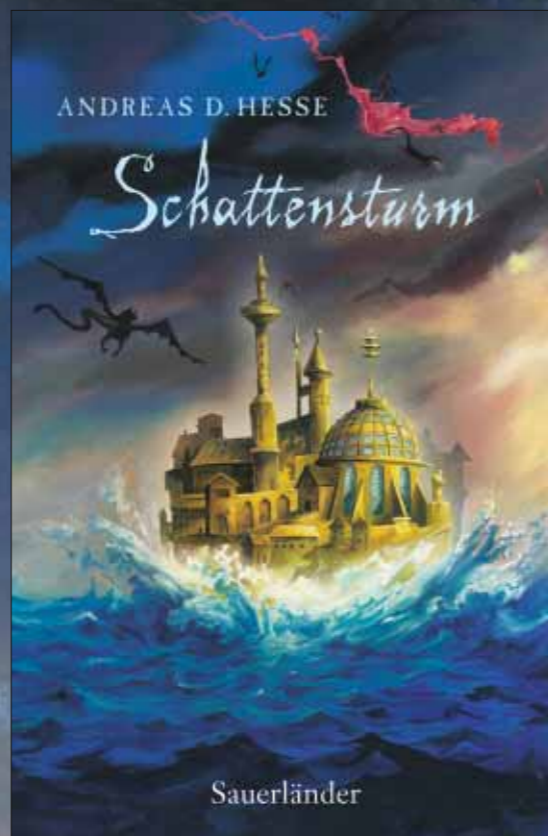

Iva Procházková was born in what is now the Czech Republic in 1953. In 1986 she went to Germany for a ten-year period. She has written books for children and adolescents for many years, winning the German Youth Literature Award, as well as a nomination for the Hans-Christian-Andersen Medal in 1997. Her title *We Will Meet When They Are All Gone* was awarded the Friedrich-Gerstäcker-Award.



A hot summer, Berlin and a rural idyll in the borderland between Saxony and the Czech Republic: This is the backdrop against which the quite different stories of five young people unfold.

There is highly talented Sylva, who finds school utterly boring and loves to spend all her time out in the open nature. Niklas would like to become a film-maker but gets bogged down in the drug scene with beautiful Evita. While her quest for absolute bliss has taken her too far down the spiral of drug abuse, Niklas manages to break free just in time. Filip is in love with Sylva, but his intellectual manner makes him his own worst enemy. It is not until another girl takes Sylva's place that he manages to overcome his inhibition. Robin tries in vain to live up to his father's expectations, denying his inner self all the time. Only when he meets Sylva does he finally learn to give rein to his own feelings.

Far from it: Whilst fishing with Till, his friend from childhood days, Jannek finds a human hand in the village pond. The police are called and they find a complete skeleton. Who then is this dead man who was buried in the pond about five years ago? Nobody in the village is missing, and no one seems to remember a stranger from five years ago. When the police find out the dead man's identity and it becomes clear that virtually everybody in the village knew him, Jannek and Till suspect foul play....

Although those in charge try a cover-up and mask the crime as a death of natural causes Martha finds out that the murder weapon comes from the Amazon Basin where relatives of the organist live. Intimidated by the management and the police, and spied on by the murderer, Martha manages to eliminate several suspects one by one, getting perilously close to the real culprit...

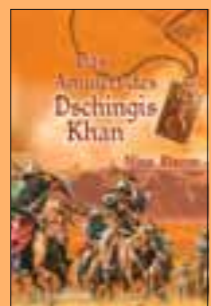

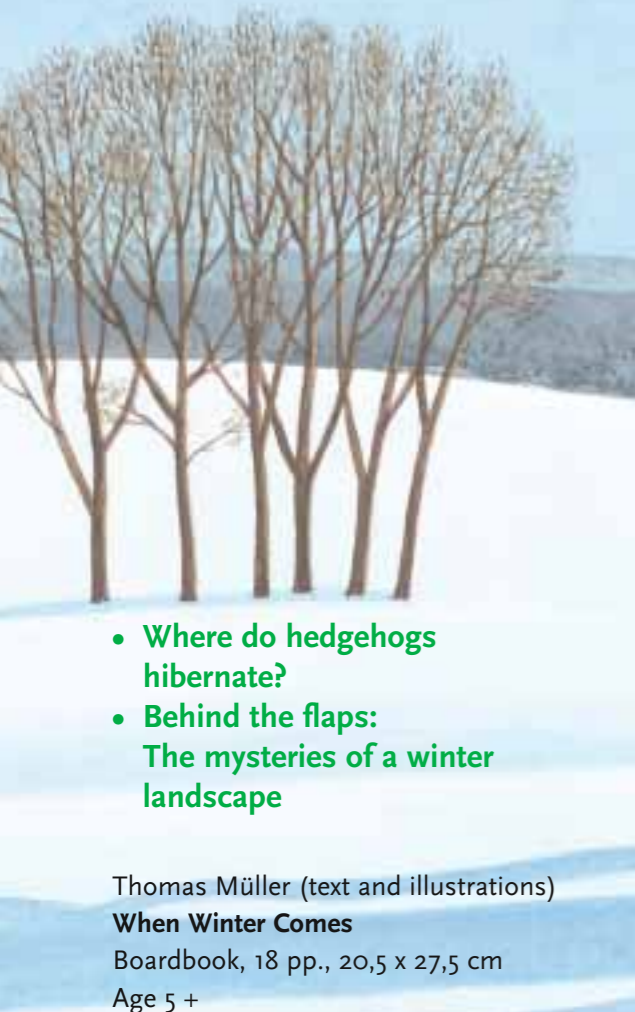
